

ORDER

The Court, having heard argument and considered the briefs of the parties, finds that the delegation provision of arbitration agreement, standing alone, clearly and unmistakably delegates the issue of arbitrability to the arbitrator. The Court also finds that the delegation provision, again, standing alone, is valid and enforceable. *Hughes v. Ancestry.com*, 580 S.W.3d 42, 47-49 (Mo. Ct. App. 2019), reh'g and/or transfer denied (June 25, 2019), transfer denied (Sept. 3, 2019).

Accordingly, the Court grants Defendant's Application to Compel Arbitration and stays proceedings pending the outcome of the arbitration.
